Call for Posters

Immigration and the Family: New Developments and Perspectives

Graduate students are invited to submit proposals for posters to present at the Broom Center's interdisciplinary workshop "Immigration and the Family: New Developments and Perspectives". The workshop will take place on **Saturday, February 23** at the University of California, Santa Barbara. The conference agenda is posted at: http://www.broomcenter.ucsb.edu/conferences_workshops.

Authors of accepted proposals will present their poster in an interdisciplinary setting, and should be prepared to communicate their findings in clear, jargon-free language. The Broom Center will provide one night of accommodation (on a shared room basis with one other graduate student of the same gender) and meals during the workshop. Students are expected to cover their own transportation expenses. Posters should be based on original empirical research conducted by the author. While presentations on any aspect of the immigrant experience (or the effects of immigrants on others) are welcome, proposals should have some demographic focus. Posters on family aspects of immigration are of particular interest, and we welcome a variety of disciplinary perspectives, including but not limited to anthropology, economics, geography, psychology and sociology.

-an extended abstract (2-3 pages) **or** a copy of the research paper or chapter on which your poster will be based

Your submission should consist of a single pdf document, with the filename LastName_FirstName.pdf, where LastName and FirstName are *your* name.

Proposals are due by 4 pm PT on Friday December 28. You will be informed of the Center's decision by mid-January.
